EXPERIENCE

1 in 5 Australian women (18.4%) have experienced sexual violence since the age of 15.

Don't confuse sexual abuse with sex; it is VIOLENCE - a form of POWER and CONTROL, and this violence is never your fault.

YOUNG PEOPLE

1 in 3 girls and
1 in 5 boys will have experienced unwanted sexual abuse before they are 18.

Sexual violence and abuse has proved to be among the most difficult and confounding social problems of our time.

HIGHER RATES

Young women
(18–24), homeless
women, women with a
disability, identify as
LGBTIQA+, ATSI &/or
CALD women,
experience significantly
higher rates of
violence.

REPORTING

Only 1 in 6 report to police of rape, and less than 1 in 7 report of incest.

Survivor voices will continue to raise awareness and improve our collective understanding of sexual abuse.

PERPETRATORS

70% of sexual assaults
are committed by someone
known to the victim, and
93% of offenders are male.
Most commonly the
perpetrator is a family
member, family friend, or a
person the victim goes to
work or school
with.

RESPONSIBILITY

An Australian
Bureau of Statistics
Survey reported 1 in 3
Australians (33%)
believed that 'rape
resulted from men not
being able to control
their need for sex'.

Perpetrators don't just assault someone in broad daylight; therefore, they're able to make conscious choices about their violence.
